Please register on the first floor of the Desloge Outpatient Center - Building A.

What information will this study give my doctor?

This scan will assist your doctor in finding neuroendocrine tumors.

What do I need to know before I get there?

On the day of the test, please do not eat or drink anything besides water 4 hours prior to your test.

Wear comfortable clothing with no metal in it.

How long will it take?

A technologist will give you an oral contrast agent if you have no allergy to contrast agents. An IV will be started and you will be given an injection of Ga68 Dotatate. You will then rest for 90 minutes. You will be asked to empty your bladder and taken to the scan room. A series of images will be taken while you lie very still. The images take about 45 minutes.
